PRESIDENT'S MESSAGE

On March 24th and 25th I had the opportunity to represent Central Pennsylvania alongside a handful of other engineers from across the state at the ASCE Legislative Fly-In in Washington, D.C. On the agenda for the 200 attendees were briefings on issues and needs with ASCE staff and key members of Congress as well as sit-down meetings with Representatives and Senators.

Talking points included the urgency to reauthorize a surface transportation bill, finding a long-term, sustainable funding mechanism for the Highway Trust Fund and implementing and funding programs in the Water Resources Reform & Development Act (WRRDA), enacted last summer. A portion of funding set forth in the WRRDA bill already exists; it is merely a matter of taking the time to appropriate the funds. On the transportation funding side, ASCE strongly supports the Update, Promote, and Develop America's Transportation Essentials Act (UPDATE Act, H.R. 680). This proposed legislation would increase the federal motor fuels tax rate by fifteen cents per gallon over three years and index the future rate to inflation. This legislation was introduced by **Representative Earl Blumenauer** (D-OR) and has been cosponsored by at least 25 members of the House.

Tax increases are never an easy message to sell when headed to Capitol Hill. It is important to note that the vast majority of representatives on both Federal and State levels who have supported gas tax increases and bills such as WRRDA have been recently re-elected. Funding our infrastructure should not be thought of as an expense but rather an investment. The return on investment in regards to economic activity is undeniable. There is likely no better boost or 'shot in the arm' to a region's economy than a large scale construction project.

I hope that even if advocacy for infrastructure funding is not your thing, you can take the time to consider its importance to your community and most likely your own profession. I challenge you to take the next step and attend a rally/support event, write your elected officials or get involved with the government affairs committee of a local organization (say for instance, ASCE?). There are a number of planned events across the state that provide an opportunity to show your support by attending or volunteering on a local level. Planned events include:

STRUCTURAL TECHNICAL COMMITTEE HOLDS FOUNDATION DESIGN WEBINAR

On Friday, January 23rd, 38 engineers from 20 companies in the ASCE Central PA Section attended the webinar entitled "Design of Foundations for Equipment Supports" sponsored by the Structural technical committee/SEI. The webinar was held at Gannett Fleming, Inc. in Camp Hill, PA.

Those in attendance learned practical methods used for design of equipment foundations and became familiar with the differences in the design approach for statically and dynamically loaded equipment. Statically loaded equipment typically includes various electrical components, such as transformers, vessels (horizontal, vertical and spherical), mechanical equipment (heat exchangers, radiators towers), stacks, etc. Dynamically loaded equipment includes compressors, turbine generators, pumps, blowers. The presentation included some actual design drawings and practical details for some of these components.

Those in attendance earned 1.5 Professional Development Hours (PDHs). Additionally lunch was provided to all attendees.
