

A bout our J anuary 22nd Meeting

Columbia Section Meeting/Presentation: January 22, 2003, 11:30 am, Shilo Inn, Richland Topic: *Conceptual Design Progress on the Chemobyl New Safe Confinement.*

A lava containing many tons of nuclear materials was fused in the heat generated by the April 26, 1986 disaster of the Chernobyl nuclear power plant in Ukraine. Due for completion in 2007 the 100-m high, 120-m long, and 260-m span vault will confine the radioactive releases to the environment. Battelle, Bechtel National, and Electricité de France are now designing this mammoth structure that will be constructed slightly away from the site, and then slid over the ruined plant. Attended by about 30 engineers Eric Schmieman's presentation on the progress of the vault design was full of information. This project recently



received an international attention. Some 160 newspapers throughout the world covered the story and latest development on this project. In November 2001, Eric first gave us a talk on this project, and naturally we were curious to hear about the progress of the design. Eric described some of the design complications, monetary implications, and political ramifications of the project.
