What is Crime Stoppers?

Crime Stoppers is a network of concerned citizens, law enforcement agencies and media, all working together to reduce crime and improve the quality of life within our communities. The Crime Stoppers concept however, has a critical difference from other programs that involve the community.

There are people who have information which could solve major crimes or help locate fugitives from justice. But either because of fear or apathy they don't come forward with what they know. Crime Stoppers is an alternative to calling 911, working on the assumption that in some cases people who would not otherwise become involved would do so if they felt safe and/or were motivated. Crime Stoppers programs offers this opportunity in two ways;

- · Guarantee's anonymity of the caller.
- · Offers a cash reward

Since 1985 when Tri Cities Crime Stoppers started it has helped local law enforcement apprehend over 1,460 fugitives, cleared over 4,360 crimes, recovered over \$910,000 in narcotics and stolen property and paid over \$52,250 in rewards.

Crime Stoppers rewards are <u>not</u> paid by tax dollars. Crime Stoppers is a 501 (c) 3 non profit organization registered in the State of Washington.

HOWARD PRESTON SCHOLARSHIP AWARD

The Columbia Section of the American Society of Civil Engineers invites applications for the Howard Preston Scholarship Award. The purpose of the scholarship is to promote excellence and professionalism in the field of Civil Engineering. The scholarship will provide financial support for the student's educational expenses.

There are two scholarships to be awarded this year, each in the amount of \$1000. Scholarships are in the form of certificates of award conditioned upon the enrollment of the student as specified under student eligibility requirements. Upon receipt of notice of enrollment from proper officials, a check for the amount of the award will be forwarded to the college or university to establish a credit for the student. Unexpended credit is subject to withdrawal if conduct of student is contrary to the intentions of ASCE.
