TOPIC:

I-90 Snoqualmie Pass East Project

The I-90 Snoqualmie Pass East Project corridor is located in Kittitas County, Washington, along a 15-mile stretch of Interstate 90 that passes through the Wenatchee National Forest. The corridor begins on the eastern side of Snoqualmie pass near Hyak and ends near Easton. The purpose of this project is to meet projected traffic demands, improve public safety and enhance wildlife connectivity along this 15-mile stretch of I-90.
