## **Monthly Meeting Presentation Summary**

We have an opportunity to learn about the largest radioactive waste treatment plant in the world. The plant is currently under construction with an estimated operation start date of 2022. The plant will "process and stabilize 56 million gallons of radioactive and chemical waste" by "blending the waste with glass-forming materials" to create a solid, stable form for storage.

This is a massive project right in our back yard and we are excited to host representatives of the Nuclear Waste Program to provide a project background and answer questions you may have. We look forward to seeing you November 8th!

## What's Next for Old SR 520 Bridge Pontoons?

The SR 520 floating bridge across Lake Washington between Seattle and Bellevue is being replaced with a new floating bridge (see information here: SR 520 Bridge Replacement and HOV Program).

There are 33 old pontoons which amount to 10 million pounds of concrete, and they are planned to be broken down into smaller pieces and removed from the site.
