Description of the Current Program

The American Society of Civil Engineers - Delaware Section (ASCE-DE Section) is sponsoring an undergraduate scholarship in the amount of at least \$1,500.00 for a student majoring in **CIVIL OR ENVIRONMENTAL ENGINEERING**. Additional scholarships may be awarded at the discretion of ASCE-DE.

Eligibility & Application Requirements

- (1) Students must have completed enough credit hours of undergraduate studies in a 4-year engineering program to have achieved at least sophomore status (students must be a Sophomore or Junior at the time of submitting the application). The program must be accredited by the Engineering Accreditation Commission of the Accreditation Board for Engineering & Technology (ABET). Transcript required upon request.
- (2) Applicants must have a minimum grade point average of 3.0 on a 4.0 scale.
- (3) Applicants must be U.S. citizens. In addition, applicants must either attend a college or university in Delaware **or** be a Delaware resident.
- (4) Applicants must provide the names and telephone numbers of two (2) references.
- (5) Applications must be received in full by close of business on the date noted above. No late or incomplete applications will be accepted or evaluated after this date.

Selection Criteria

The following criteria will be used by the Scholarship Selection Committee as the basis for selecting the recipients of these engineering scholarships.

Grade Point Average	40
Essay (max 500 words)	30
Activities, honors & recommendations	30
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Total Points	100
