Call to Order:

The meeting was called to order at 4:35 pm. A quorum was present.

Approval of March Meeting Minutes:

A motion was made by Tom DesMarais and seconded by Andrew Kilpo to approve March meeting minutes. Minutes were approved unanimously.

UMD Student Update:

The UMD group has been selected for national competition in June for concrete canoe. A request was made by Karth Whiteside for support from the Duluth Section to help cover costs for this trip. Our understanding is that total costs for this tripe are expected to be in excess of \$8,000.

The board discussed this matter and it was agreed that we would like to support the student group but that we need additional information as to the specifics of the costs, and the amount of support requested. It was agreed that we could agree at this meeting to support this trip and determine the dollar amount of support in an e-mail vote to be conducted after we get further documentation and a support amount is settled on. It was agreed that according to our bylaws an e-mail vote would require 100% support from the board to pass.

Andrew Kilpo made a motion to support the UMD group's trip to the national competition for concrete canoe with a financial contribution that would be agreed upon later by an e-mail vote of the board. Andrew Barnebey seconded the motion. The motion passed unanimously.

Student road cleanup sponsorship is coming up shortly. This was briefly discussed.

The Matrix was reviewed and it was agreed that we are on track.

New Business:

1. Past President gift was discussed. It was agreed that different Past Presidents have wanted different gifts. Some possible gifts include a commemorative plaque, apparel, and a gift certificate to the place of the past presidents choosing.

It was agreed that the board should determine the amount of the gift currently under consideration for Past President Tom DesMarais, and that the board should set a precedent for the dollar amount and type of past presidents gifts.

A motion was made by Andrew Barnebey that the Presidents gift value should be set, nominally at \$100, in any combination of: commemorative plaques or similar items, apparel, and gift certificates of the Past Presidents choosing. This would be for the current gift for Tom DesMarais and for future Past Presidents. Gift value to be increased due to inflation at the Board's discretion. \$100 to be considered a nominal, and guiding value, such that the Board could for example, at their discretion, make a gift of a plaque with a total value of \$53.00 and a gift certificate of \$50.00 to the Past President, and these gifts would be considered to meet the nominal \$100 value. Motion was seconded by Andrew Kilpo. The motion passed unanimously.

2. Region assembly – July $19 - 20^{\text{th}}$ (Green Bay). It was agreed that the Board should encourage Brett Ballavance to attend. It was also discussed that Andrew Kilpo and Tom DesMarais could possibly attend.

The canoe measures at 18'-6" and weighs 265lbs. With a black design, the canoe reflects the night sky with constellations placed around. The team finished fourth overall in the conference with first place finishes in the rowing and display categories.
