

PFAS – Sources in the Environment, Rules, Regulations, and Treatment Options

Per- and poly- fluorinated alkyl substances (PFAS) have emerged as high priority contaminants for management around the world. PFAS are highly water soluble, have low volatility, and are recalcitrant to chemical oxidation; biological treatment and other common remediation approaches. They are introduced to the environment in Aqueous Film Forming Foam, commonly called AFFF or firefighting foam, as well as in common household items like stain resistant carpets, non-stick pans, and even quick-serve food packaging. States are moving forward with Maximum Contaminant Level (MCL) recommendations for some of the compounds found in drinking water. Many states in the northeast (including Maine) have set up task force committees to evaluate the problem and fast track treatment solutions. Innovation is required to successfully and sustainably treat these compounds.

MBTA 2019 PDH TOUR FRIDAY, SEPTEMBER 27, 2019

Please join us for the 2019 MBTA PDH Tour. We will be learning about two innovative Maine projects, and participants will earn up to 6 PDH credits.

MAINE TURNPIKE WIDENING IN PORTLAND

In the fall of 2018, the Maine Turnpike Authority kicked off a five-mile, four-year, \$145 million widening program that will create a safer, smoother highway and reduce traffic congestion through the Portland area. The program includes the construction of new northbound and southbound travel lanes, four bridge replacements, the widening of four other bridges, construction of a new Exit 45 and other safety-related improvements. Construction is currently underway on five of the bridges with individual projects related to the widening expected to continue for the next three years.

PORTLAND INTERNATIONAL JETPORT SUSTAINABILITY

In 2016, the Jetport commissioned the first on-airport facility in the United States to capture, recycle and remanufacture aircraft de-icing fluid as part of a closed loop system. Today, the facility recycles glycol-contaminated stormwater, including de-icing fluid from other airports in the region. The tour will include a work-in-progress look at the Jetport's third aircraft de-icing pad under construction this summer by Sargent Corporation. When complete, the three pads will allow the Jetport to de-ice three aircraft simultaneously, reducing delays during peak travel times.

"Transportation in Maine, Post-Legislative Session"

Please join WTS as we kick off our Fall Season with this informative, dynamic discussion regarding Maine transportation successes, challenges, and thoughts moving forward.

At the top of the discussion will be the \$105 million bond that lawmakers just voted to pass! The bond passed 32-0 in the Senate and 127-8 in the House. The funding will be used to upgrade roads, bridges, ports, rail, and air transportation, as well as to repair culverts and restore a commercial fishing wharf. The bonding will draw an estimated \$137 million in matching federal and other additional funds. This bond will now head to the ballot for voters in November.


