Cone Penetration Testing – A Tool for Contending with the Challenging Presumpscot Clay

The cone penetration test (CPT) is a geotechnical investigation technique which has been used to supplement or replace traditional geotechnical boring explorations to obtain a continuous profile of the subsurface and develop in-situ soil properties with empirical correlations. In Maine, geotechnical engineers face many challenges when new construction is built on top of (or cut in to) the soft Presumpscot Clay. This presentation discusses the advantages and limitations of the CPT in soft ground conditions, particularly Presumpscot Clay, for evaluations of settlement predictions, preload designs, bearing capacity analyses, and seismic site classification. Multiple case studies will be discussed where the CPT played a vital role in the success of the project.

The Honorable Jane F. Garvey, North America
Chairman of Meridiam Infrastructure, has spent a
distinguished career in the public arena, leading some of the
nation's most complicated and complex transportation
initiatives. Since May 2018, she has also served as
Chairman of United Airlines Board of Directors.

Prior to her current roles, Ms. Garvey led the U.S. Public/Private Partnerships advisory group at JP Morgan, where she advised states on financing strategies to facilitate much-needed project delivery for state governments.

During her career in public service, Ms. Garvey served as the 14th Administrator of the Federal Aviation Administration (FAA) from August 1997 to August 2002; she was the first woman Administrator and the first Administrator to serve a full five-year term. As Administrator of the FAA, Ms. Garvey guided the agency through many safety and modernization milestones. She pioneered the FAA through Y2K preparation and implementation. She led the agency through the extraordinarily formidable events of September 11, 2001 with compassion and assurance of mission.

Ms. Garvey is recognized for her breadth of experience at all levels of government. She served as Acting Administrator and Deputy Administrator of the Federal Highway Administration (FHWA). Among her accomplishments at FHWA, she conceived and developed the Innovative Financing Initiative —properly named GARVEE bonds, enabling states to use federal highway funds more effectively. Before leading the FHWA, she was director of Boston's Logan International Airport. From 1988 to 1991, she was Commissioner of the Massachusetts Department of Public Works.

Ms. Garvey has received numerous awards of distinction and recognition for her leadership and public service, and is recognized for her deliberate collaboration and ability to bring all stakeholders together.
