Maine Section ASCE volunteers and industry experts have been working diligently thought the summer on 16 draft reports for our 2020 Report Card for Maine's Infrastructure. Every four years, the Maine Section provides a comprehensive assessment which results in the *Report Card on Maine's Infrastructure*. Using publicly available data and consults with industry experts, the Report Card analyzes the current condition and needs to assign a simple A to F letter grade to 16 infrastructure categories. On December 1 at 10 am (location TBD) we will release the grades during a media event. Our intention is the provide a live video feed to share with ASCE members and other interested parties. We will have some invited guests speak on importance of infrastructure including Dana Conners, CEO of the Maine State Chamber of Commerce. The purpose of the *Report Card* is to raise public awareness of the importance of modern and well-
