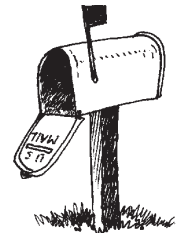

University of Maryland Engineers Without Borders Student Chapter Update

The University of Maryland Engineers Without Borders Student Chapter has adopted an ambitious program for the next year.

At the end of this academic semester – in only a few weeks – seven members of the chapter are planning to go to Samli, in northern Thailand. The hill tribes in Thailand do not have access to proper health care, but there are two parts to that problem: arranging for doctors, and having an adequate health care facility. Building the health care facility is the purpose of our project. This will be done in coordination with student chapters at UCLA, Columbia University, and the West Coast Professional EWB chapter. Dr. Deborah Goodings <goodings@umd.edu> is the faculty mentor for this project.

The students are discussing a possible project on the Pine Ridge Native American Reservation in South Dakota. They are evaluating the feasibility of straw bale building construction. These structures are quick to construct, inexpensive, and provided they are properly sealed from moisture, have a long life. The

bales also have insulation qualities equivalent to super-insulation: R40. Dr. Jungho Kim (kimjh@eng.umd.edu) is the faculty mentor for this project.

The students are sorting through other projects for next year, including constructing an orphanage in the Central African Republic; and partnering with a local NGO for a project in Kazakhstan.
