## EBA Engineering wins 2005 Honor Award from ACEC/MD



The American Council of Engineering Companies/Maryland (ACEC/MD) has announced its 2005 Engineering Excellence Awards (EEA). EBA Engineering, Inc. a distinguished civil engineering design firm from Baltimore, Maryland won the 2005 Honor Award, or 2nd place, on its project "Charles Street Streetscape, Saratoga St. to Centre St".

City of Baltimore, Department of Transportation, awarded EBA Engineering a contract to design and prepare construction documents for a major portion of one of the City's oldest and longest thoroughfare, and called it "Charles Street Streetscape Improvements

from Saratoga Street to Centre Street." This portion is known as the "Mount Vernon, Historical, Cultural, and Business District." The design of the project was completed in December of 2002. Construction commenced in July of 2003, and the project was substantially completed in May of 2004, at a cost of about \$4,300,000. The challenges included designing streetscape improvements to enhance the general attractiveness of the area, while preserving features with historical significance, addressing design challenges such as underground sidewalk cavities/vaults, utility relocation/protection, maintaining customer access to various businesses, and minimizing the disturbance to pedestrian and vehicle traffic through the area during construction.

Today, the street's new makeover has positively driven business, real estate, and has once again, regained its historical appeal, with the "Washington Monument" standing tall, at the north end of the project.

## Jha Testifies Before Legislative Committees

Governor Robert Ehrlich has signed into law two bills important to the engineering community for business reasons. ASCE Director Manoj K. Jha, P.E., PhD, testified before the Senate committee in favor of both bills and was present in Annapolis for the bill signing.

Senate Bill 143 amends the statute requiring a certificate of merit before the filing of a lawsuit against a design professional to include corporations, partnerships or other entities through which a licensed design professional works. The amendment overrides a decision by the Court of Appeals that interpreted the law as applying only to individuals.

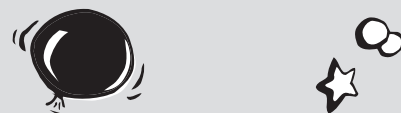
Senate Bill 14 amended the Courts & Judicial Proceedings Article by reducing the time in which a person may seek recovery for damages incurred for an error in a survey of land from 20 to 15 years after the survey, or within years after the discovery of the error, whichever comes first. The statute or repose for architects and professional engineers is 10 years from the date the improvement becomes available for its intended use.

Dr. Jha testified on the bills as government affairs chair for the Maryland Society of Professional Engineers.

A third bill important to professional engineers and other design professionals was passed by the House, where Dr. Jha also testified, but failed to come out of the Senate committee. It is expected to be introduced again next session. This bill, House Bill 110, would have clarified the application of the mechanic's liens law for professional engineers, landscape architects and surveyors. It had been opposed on the basis that it expanded the law with respect to the precise scope of services covered. Assistant Attorney General Kathryn M. Rowe has advised that Maryland case law makes it clear that architectural and similar services are included within the mechanic's lien law, but leave the exact services that fall within the scope of "work done for or about the building and for materials furnished for or about the building" somewhat uncertain.

I do highway design, utility and right-of-way coordination, field investigations, value engineering, quality control, and project coordination.


**What have been your favorite projects?**
