Membership




Figure 1. Membership by Month for Past Twelve Months of Available Data




Figure 2. Membership since 2010

At the end of December 2019, the Seattle Section and Branches has 2,221 members (Seattle 1,874, North Branch 121, and Kitsap Branch 124, and unaffiliated 2). There are 441 YMF members now. *Figure 1* illustrates the breakout of Seattle Section membership by Section and Branch. *Table 2* shows a breakdown of members per Branch for the past 12 months of available data. *Figure 2* illustrates Seattle Section membership trends since 2010. As you can see, we had a drop of almost 240 members this month.

The membership database received from ASCE headquarters had 14 duplicates this month. I suspect that these duplicates are because some members pay dues in a branch and Seattle.
