

He joined the agency as Deputy Secretary in October 2015 and was appointed Acting Secretary by Governor Jay Inslee in February 2016. He was appointed Secretary of Transportation in August of 2016. Roger oversees an agency of 6,800 employees, with responsibility for 18,600 lane miles of highway, 3,800 bridges, general aviation airports, passenger- and freightrail programs, and Washington State Ferries, the nation's largest ferry system.

Roger is a distinguished member of ASCE and an excellent speaker. He has published articles at the national level and is an active contributor to our local ASCE communities.

Recent Events

City of Tacoma: Transportation Master Plan

In November, Josh Diekmann with the City of Tacoma presented the City's master transportation plan to our section. Josh is the City's Transportation Engineer. The discussion was well attended and the presentation was fascinating. The presentation was rich with useful information and was even attended by staff from other agencies looking to pursue a similar planning path.

The topics discussed included the process by which the City prioritized modes of transportation along different corridors, the public involvement process in developing the plan, and the financial aspects of the study that back the plan. The plan is progressive in that it is inclusive of all types of transportation, but recognizes that it isn't possible or appropriate for all corridors to be designed for every mode of transportation. The plan was coordinated with other agencies, including Pierce Transit and



Sound Transit, so that actions the City takes are in harmony with actions those agencies have planned for the horizon. The plan is comprehensive in that it contains some recommendations on capital projects the City could undertake, but also seeks to help inform the direction and regulation of private development within key areas of the City. The plan is a powerful tool to aid the City's decision makers.

The presentation even included some new vocabulary! A "walkshed" is defined as an area within which a person could reasonably navigate between locations on foot. Tacoma used the "20-Minute Neighborhood" concept to establish its walksheds and located the walksheds within critical areas, usually characterized by high-density neighborhoods or popular amenities. Volunteering Opportunities

Committees and Section Positions

Membership Steward; *Approx. time commitment: 0 to 2 days per month.* This standing position with the Section is responsible for increasing member recruitment, retention, and participation. The position may include occasionally being a lead for events, interpreting survey/feedback information from members, and attending board meetings.

Government Relations Committee Chair; *Approx. time commitment: 0 to 2 days per month.* The Government Relations Committee is a standing committee within the Section.
