Local Engineers Honored by West Virginia Section of the American Society of Civil Engineers

At the 2015 Annual Meeting of the West Virginia Section of the American Society of Civil Engineers (ASCE) two local engineers were awarded prestigious honors recognizing their contributions to the civil engineering profession. The society announced Roger K. Randolph, P.E., as the 2015 recipient of the Roy D. Koch Award in recognition of his outstanding dedication and unselfish participation in the Society and Engineering Profession. The society also announced Wael Zatar, Ph.D., as the recipient of the 2015 Outstanding Civil

Engineering Educator of the Year Award.

Mr. Randolph graduated from Ohio University with a bachelor's degree in civil engineering in 1967. He went on to obtain his master's courses at West Virginia Institute of Technology in 1972. He is a registered Professional Engineer in West Virginia, Kentucky and Ohio and also a registered Professional Licensed Surveyor in West Virginia. He began his career as an Engineer at Union Carbide working under Roy Koch from 1967-1972. In the early 1970's he established his business Randolph Engineering, in Scott Depot, with his wife Grace in the basement of their home. He is a Past President of ASCE, a founding and active member in the Putnam Chamber of Commerce, and serves on the board with the Putnam County Solid Waste Authority. In 2009 he received the Volunteer of The Year Award from the Putnam County Development Authority and in 2014 he received the Mayo Lester Community Service Award from The Putnam County Chamber of Mr. Randolph and his wife Grace have been longtime active Commerce. volunteers in Putnam County and have been very supportive members of the society.

Dr. Zatar received both his bachelor's and master's degrees in civil engineering from Cairo University in Egypt, and his Ph.D., also in civil engineering, from Saitama University in Japan. His over 25 years of research and expertise in the field of prestressed concrete and structures have gained national and international acclaim. He has written over 165 journal and technical publications, reviewed 4 textbooks, and given many presentations across the globe. Dr. Zatar came to our region in 2004, as an Assistant Professor in Civil Engineering at WVU Institute of Technology and joined Marshall University's engineering faculty in 2006. Since 2011, Dr. Zatar has served as Dean of Marshall University's College of Information Technology and Engineering and has tirelessly worked on the establishment of the new Arthur Weisberg Family Applied Engineering Complex. He is a member of the Pre-stressed Concrete Institute, Past-President of the WV Section of ASCE, is a member of 31 national engineering/education committees.

As a society, we are now 150,000+ strong with members in 177 countries around the world. There are currently 339 student chapters, with 53 of them outside of the US. The three ASCE strategic initiatives are (1) SUSTAINABLE INFRASTRUCTURE, (2) RAISE THE BAR and (3) the ASCE GRAND CHALLENGE. As civil engineers, we are entrusted to maintain and modernize America's deteriorating infrastructure as well as make our communities sustainable (1). The investments needed to improve our infrastructure continue to increase well beyond available funding. 
