The following items were discussed:

1. Report from Region 1 of ASCE – Tom Wamser is probably still attending the ASCE Legislative Fly-In in Washington, DC, on March 18-20, 2026.
2. 2026 CSCE In-Person Monthly Dinner Meetings and Webinars
  - 2.1 Recap of Monthly Dinner Meetings on February 10 at UNH and on February 17 at the University of Hartford – These meetings were well-received. At the meeting on February 17, the attendees learned that approximately 50 students attended the engineering summer camp at the University of Hartford in 2025.
  - 2.2 Planning Fall 2026 CSCE Dinner Meetings now because venues get booked up by June 2026. Ideas are below:
    - September – Three Rivers could host the dinner meeting with catered food & cash bar.
    - October – UConn prefers hosting a dinner meeting in October since it has a major industry event in September. Right now, all Tuesdays and Wednesdays in October are open at the Graduate by Hilton Storrs, except for the 27th and 28th. For November, all Tuesdays and Wednesdays are open except for the 11th.
    - November – Quinnipiac has the following dates available: Sept. 1, 2, 22, Oct. 20, 21, and Nov. 3, 4, 17, 18, 24.
    - Some holidays in the fall are Labor Day (9/7/26), Rosh Hashanah (9/12/26), Yom Kippur (9/20-21/26), Veterans Day (11/11/26)
    - CSCE could put a soft hold on some dates to reserve them for the October and November meetings.
  - 2.3 Future Topics for Webinars/Dinner Meetings: CSCE could host webinars on UConn’s certificate programs and the Stonebridge Crossing in Cheshire, CT. CSCE could offer a dinner meeting presentation on Downtown Revitalization in Naugatuck.
