Connecticut has launched a first-of-its-kind effort to reimagine the everyday bus stop and transform it into a safer, more accessible, and more welcoming part of the public transportation experience. CTDOT's Bus Stop Enhancement Program is more than a shelter installation project — it is a statewide approach to improving how riders interact with transit, how communities connect to service, and how infrastructure can support dignity, comfort, and reliability for the people who depend on it every day. This presentation will give transportation professionals a closer look at how the program is being delivered across Connecticut, from selecting locations and coordinating with towns to advancing feasibility, design, installation, and long-term maintenance. Attendees will leave with a better understanding of how thoughtful bus stop improvements can strengthen the transit network, improve the rider experience, and support more accessible and connected communities.

Please join civil engineering students, friends, colleagues and CSCE members at our monthly meeting at CT State Community College Three Rivers, Norwich, CT, on Wednesday, September 23, 2026. At this meeting, Andrew Millovitsch, CTDOT Project Engineer, will give a presentation on the I-95 Interchange Improvements at Route 161 and Replacement of Bridge No. 00250 in East Lyme, CT. One (1) New York State PDH will be offered at this meeting. This meeting is co-sponsored by the CT Chapter of the ASCE Transportation & Development Institute and students & faculty at CT State Community College Three Rivers.

DOT Project No. 0044-0156 was awarded to Manafort Brothers Inc. on January 31, 2023, at a

contract amount of \$148,299,008.15. The 4-year project consists of a complete overhaul of the Exit 74 Interchange of Interstate 95, and a replacement of Bridge No. 00250 carrying I-95 over Route 161 in the town of East Lyme, CT. All the interchange on and off ramps have been improved and lengthened to provide acceleration and deceleration opportunities for traffic entering and exiting the interstate. Sight line issues that have existed in the past have been eliminated by the vast cut and fill operation that improved the profile of I-95 significantly. A permanent third lane is being added between Exits 74 and 75. The bridge has been doubled in length and width to accommodate a third lane on I-95 and widening to Route 161 below. Raised islands, improved drainage, increased pedestrian safety, and a new commuter lot are some of the highlights included on Route 161.

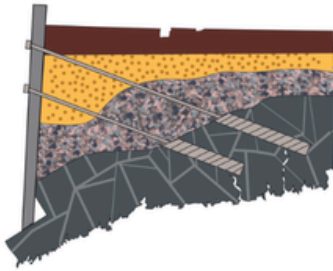

Please join CSCE at our monthly meeting at the Graduate Hotel at the University of Connecticut, Storrs, CT, on Wednesday, October 28, 2026. This meeting will feature a presentation on I-91/I-691/ Route 15 Interchange Improvements in Meriden, CT, by representatives of Parsons. This meeting is co-sponsored by the Connecticut Chapter of the ASCE Transportation & Development Institute and the ASCE Student Chapter at the University of Connecticut, Storrs, CT. Attendees may earn 1 NYS PDH at this event.

Parsons served as the lead designer for this \$550 million ACE Award-winning interchange improvement program, delivering the complete design for a major interchange upgrade. The project includes pavement rehabilitation along 5 miles of I-91, 2 miles each of Route 15 and I-691 and associated local roads. The scope also encompasses 68 structures, including 29 new retaining walls, full replacement of 6 bridges, rehabilitation and widening of existing bridges and culverts, as well as storm drainage, noise walls, public outreach, permitting, utility relocation, ITS, illumination, and right-of-way impacts.

A Needs & Deficiencies Study identified several operational and safety issues, most notably that the system ramps connecting I-91 and Route 15 in both northbound and southbound directions had insufficient capacity, inadequate weaving distances, and a confusing configuration. Following an alternatives analysis, the ramp layout was finalized to address these concerns.

To align delivery with CTDOT's capital program commitments, the overall interchange improvement effort was divided into 3 separate projects, each with independent utility. Of these, 1 project was delivered using a design-build procurement method, while the other two were advanced through design-bid-build. The design-build phase has already been completed, and the remaining two projects are currently under construction. Completion of the overall program is anticipated by December 2030.

In addition to connecting with students at UConn, meeting new friends and catching up with former colleagues, meeting attendees will learn about the application of FHWA's Performance Based Practical Design guidelines and the treatment of asphalt overlays over the existing concrete pavement during this evening.

This presentation covers key aspects of mine subsidence

engineering, a subject that is not well understood, and embraces a number of engineering disciplines. It focuses on the causes of mine subsidence and how mine stability relates to the resulting ground movements. Different mining and geologic conditions determine the mode of failure of the mine. The mode of mine failure in turn affects the resulting subsidence movement. Prediction of subsidence and damage potential or risk are also key aspects of subsidence engineering. Case histories will be presented which illustrate different ground movement and damage scenarios. This presentation will be presented in a manner that will be understandable to anyone that would be interested in learning more about mine subsidence.

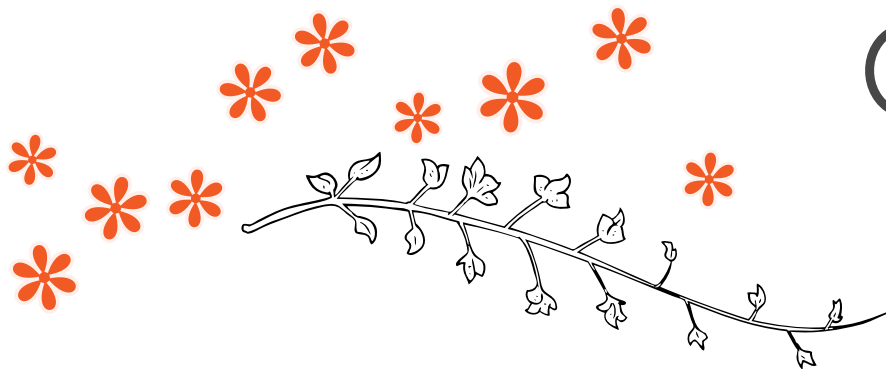
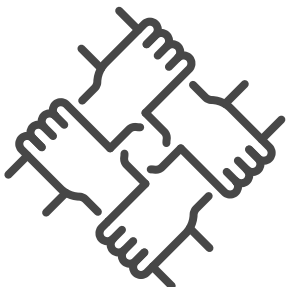

SURVEYING TOTAL STATION

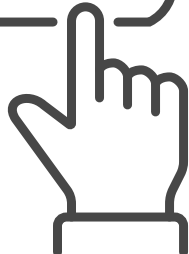
CCSU ENGINEERING
