GOES TO SUMMER CAMP

The CSCE Younger Member Group (YMG) hosted engaging presentations at a summer camp held at the University of Hartford for high school students on July 8th and 15th. The sessions introduced students to the field of civil engineering, with a focused discussion on transportation engineering. The presentations explored various types of intersection controls, including 2-way stops, all-way stops, signalized intersections, and roundabouts.





To enhance understanding, an interactive activity was conducted where students acted as vehicles navigating a T-intersection. They experienced firsthand how each control type functions and impacts traffic flow. The intersection was progressively modified to demonstrate the advantages and challenges of each setup. This handson approach allowed students to visualize realworld transportation concepts in action and highlighted the importance of selecting the appropriate control method based on traffic conditions.
