Rose Kopecky is a civil engineer based in Duluth, MN, with over 11 years of experience in municipal and site design. She currently works at SEH, where she leads a team in designing roadway projects, heads the Fun! Committee, and is assisting in developing a Civil Technical Designer Training Program. Alex is a senior engineer with the City of Duluth focusing on the design and construction of the City's state aid routes. He is the City's project manager for the West Superior Street reconstruction project. Before joining the City in 2021 he was a designer with SEH in their Duluth and Chippewa Falls offices.

Abstract:

This presentation will cover the planning, public involvement, and design of the 1.65-mile reconstruction of West Superior Street, spanning from Carlton Street to Michigan Street. The project includes comprehensive upgrades such as new storm sewers with green infrastructure, updated signals at Garfield Ave and 27th Ave West, and the replacement of the watermain with a new 20" HDPE pipe. Additionally, all lighting and fiber optic cables will be new, along with the installation of new BRT stations, bike paths, and an electric vehicle charging station. Enhanced streetscape elements, including plantings, furnishings, amenity spaces, and wayfinding signage, will also be incorporated to improve the area's overall aesthetic and functionality.

28TH TOOTHPICK BRIDGE COMPETITION IS A RESOUNDING SUCCESS!

On Tuesday, March 25, 2025, the ASCE Duluth Section relaunched the Toothpick Bridge competition. Held at the UMD Swenson Civil Engineering Building, the event was deemed a resounding success by organizers. Thirty-eight (38) teams from 4 different area high schools descended upon the CE building to test their bridge designs in the categories of "Most Aesthetically Pleasing," "Strongest," and "Most Economical." Competitors hailed from Cromwell, Duluth Denfeld, Superior and Lakeview Christian Academy.

A hardy crew of 10-12 ASCE and UMD volunteers were able to check in all participants, issue instructions, judge bridges, and conduct the weigh-ins all within the budgeted time.

The Most Aesthetically Pleasing bridge was constructed by a Denfeld High School student. Other award winning teams/schools are listed below:

Strongest Bridge:

- o 3rd Place = 35.9 lb (Cromwell Wright)
- o 2nd Place = 47.7 lb (Duluth Denfeld)
- o 1st Place = 61.0 lb (Cromwell Wright) (Bridge weight = 0.114 lb) (It held 535 times its own weight!)

Most Economical: The three lightest bridges to hold a minimum of 20 lbs

- o 3rd Place = Cromwell Wright (Bridge Weight = 0.098 lb; held 35.9 lb)
- o 2nd Place = Superior (Bridge Weight = 0.089 lb; held 25.4 lb)
- o 1st Place = Duluth Denfeld (Bridge Weight = 0.080 lb; held 28.8 lb)

This was the 28th running of the competition, a once annual event was suspended due to the COVID pandemic. Event organizers look to bring it back as an annual tradition, bigger and better in 2026. The "lessons learned" from the 2025 event will serve us well as we look to invite more teams and schools in the future. A greater pool of volunteers will be needed in the future also however! So, keep your eyes peeled to the pages of this newsletter for volunteer opportunities in 2026.
