Since 2011, Steve has served as the Resident Engineer for St. Louis County, overseeing construction delivery, contract administration, and field operations on a wide range of




transportation and water-resource projects. He played a key role in the 2012 flood recovery efforts and has managed the design and construction on more than \$300 million in roadway construction throughout the region.
