

Rock Row Construction Update

Presented by: Ian Mackinnon, PE (Jones & Beach Engineers) and Adam St. Michel (Shaw Brothers)

Come join ASCE as we tour the active Rock Row construction site in Westbrook. The 100-acre development will feature over 2 million square feet of commercial, residential, and hospitality space. The project will include 400,000 square feet of Class A office space, a 100,000-square-foot medical and wellness campus, and 450,000 square feet of retail, featuring a mix of 20-plus restaurants, from fast casual to gourmet dining, as well as shops, interactive experiences, and a movie theater.


2024 ASCE Presidents and Governors Forum and Leader Orientation

On September 15th and 16th, over 100 Section and Branch Presidents, Region Governors, incoming Society Directors, Technical Region Leaders, Committee Members, and Presidential Officers from around the world participated in the 2024 Presidents and Governors Forum and Leader Orientation at ASCE Headquarters. This event hosted by the Leader Training Committee provided opportunities for attendees to learn about ASCE resources, network with other ASCE leaders, discuss best practices, and develop leadership skills that would benefit their ASCE groups.

The program began with a Welcome and Society Overview by President-elect Feniosky A. Peña-Mora and Executive Director Tom Smith. Following the welcome, the participants were engaged in a 2-part dynamic leadership session on "It's Not Where You Start, It's Where You Finish!" by COL Jim O'Brien, P.E., M.ASCE. Brock Barry, Ph.D., P.E., F.ASCE from West Point brought his expertise to the table with presentations on Nonverbal Communication Skills and Presentation Skills – How to Wow Your Audience! Afterwards our Section and Branch leaders shared successful programs and activities during our Best Practices sessions. ASCE's General Counsel Tara Hoke capped off the day with a presentation on Legal Issues impacting ASCE's local groups.

On the second day attendees participated in an interactive session with President-elect Feniosky Peña-Mora, President-elect Elect Marsha Anderson Bomar, and Executive Director Tom Smith, followed by an engaging discussion on **Proposed Changes to ASCE Membership** from Society Director, Ken Mika. The day continued with attendees discussing **Section/Branch Challenges and Brainstorming a Presidential Plan** and **Sharing Measurable Goals and Lessons Learned.** And we ended the day with closing remarks by our 2025 ASCE President-elect, Marsha Anderson Bomar.


