The first quarter of 2024 has been a busy year for the LA Section and all the Branches, Institutes, Younger Member and Life Member Groups, as well as our Student Chapters.

Many of our LA Section members had an opportunity to exchange ideas and build relationships with other fellow members from across Regions 8 and 9 at the Multi-Region Leadership Conference (MRLC) held in Seattle, WA in early February.

Engineer's Week (Feb 19th-24th) events were held by multiple ASCE Branches and Younger Member Groups. The Metropolitan Los Angeles Branch (MLAB) Younger Member Forum held their annual week-long celebration of Engineer's Week by engaging with K-12 students with various hands-on STEM activities at multiple locations.
