Royal Colonial Boundary of 1665
National Historic Civil Engineering Landmark
Plaque Dedication

The landmark, officially named in 1985, represents the boundary between Virginia and North Carolina and between Kentucky and Tennessee. This is the second of two plaques recognizing this Civil Engineering achievement. The first plaque has been dedicated and is located at Cumberland Gap National Historic Park.

About the Landmark:

The Royal Colonial Boundary of 1665 was decreed by England's King Charles II to demarcate his American colonies. It provided a survey from the Atlantic Ocean to the Mississippi River along 36 degrees, 30 minutes north latitude. The boundary now serves to divide Virginia from North Carolina and Kentucky from Tennessee.



The survey, completed in five stages, was one of the first times a surveyed line was so long that the curve of the Earth had to be taken into consideration. It drew attention both to the importance and to the difficulty of cadastral surveying (to delimit and identify property lines) and geodetic surveying (in which the form and size of the earth are considered). It demonstrated some of the first attempts to locate an exact geographical position on the ground.

The 1665 line of 36 degrees, 30 minutes north latitude was recognized as the de facto dividing line between the North and the South in the Missouri Compromise of 1820.

Chattanooga Branch Report

The primary focus of the Chattanooga Branch has been to continue and build on our monthly program. While continuing this effort, the Branch is also strengthening student chapter relations and having a more active role in the community. Over the year, this program consisted of seven technical presentations including a day long workshop, two social events, two community service events, participation in SE Regional Student Conference and participation in E-week and the annual Section meeting. - November consisted of our first and wildly successful School of Rock coordinated by the Tennessee Concrete Pipe Association in conjunction with ASCE raising \$805 for the ASCE Chattanooga Scholarship Fund while providing participants with 6 PDHs.
- In December, we held our annual Holiday Social (joint event with TSPE and ACEC) along with our annual Toys for Tots drive

ASCE Chattanooga Branch sponsored and played an active role in the annual Tennessee River Rescue event on October 17th. The SPAG grant that our branch received was used for radio spots promoting the importance of civil engineers and introduction of children to civil engineering (promoted asceville.org). Dr. Ignatius Formunung was selected as the 2015 ASCE Outstanding Faculty Advisor for his work and dedication to the University of Tennessee at Chattanooga ASCE Student Chapter.

Around the time of installation, the incoming Vice President was relocated,

so a revised slate of officers (see below) were elected at the October meeting for the next year with terms ending after the annual 2016 conference. The new group is engaged in making our local branch bigger and better for 2016. The goals identified for this year include:

- Build on our monthly technical program
- Strengthen relationships between other engineering organizations (TSPC, ACEC) and TN Association of Professional Surveyors SE Chapter
- Increase community involvement: TN River Rescue, K-12 Outreach (ACE Mentor Program), E-Week

- Participate more frequently in TN, regional, and national ASCE events (Multi-Region Leadership Conference & Fly-In)

The plant educated us as to the way work orders are used, the types and frequency of inspections and certifications, and the different types of products made at the Lenoir City Plant and other Sherman Dixie Plants across the nation.
