


#### **President's Message**

#### Fraudulent Email Reminder



Since many of the Sections and Branches are installing their new officers, we like to remind our members of fraudulent email requests that may be asking for contributions to a variety of charities or payments for other purchases.

These emails may appear to be innocent based on the subject line, but are often an attempt to solicit money or personal information from you, or entice you to open an attachment and expose your computer to Malware, viruses, etc.

Please remember to exercise extreme caution if you receive any email messages which may seem even slightly suspicious or unusual. You can always call ASCE or the sender to verify if the email is legitimate.

- P.S. Here are some "red flags" that may help you to identify that an email request is a phishing scam (source: PGI.net):
- 1: *Intimidating or Rushing*: The sender demands immediate action and/or seeks to intimidate you into making a quick decision.
- 2: *Contains Mistakes*: The email contains bad grammar and/or spelling mistakes (this is particularly true if the email is purported to come from a business or professional organization)
- 3: Seeks Private or Sensitive Information, such as account numbers, passwords, etc.
- 4: Includes a Suspicious Attachment
- 5: *Spoofed Email Address or Hyperlink*: For spoofed emails, you can click to reply and confirm that the return address matches the address for your contact.


